- 1. The applicant must have graduated high school and be continuing their education at an accredited institution of higher education in the year in which they are applying.
- 2. The applicant must be a Michigan resident and a youth livestock exhibitor for a minimum of three years.
- 3. Applications will be judged on:
- a) Livestock participation/involvement b) Leadership c) Citizenship
- 4. If there is not an applicant that meets the criteria for this scholarship, the Michigan Junior Livestock Society Scholarship Committee reserves the right to not award a scholarship that year.
- 5. Applications will be judged on content submitted and following the criteria of the application. Applicants may be interviewed at the discretion of the Michigan Junior Livestock Society Scholarship Committee.
- 6. The application will be a maximum of five pages and two original letters of recommendation. Please do not provide additional documents (transcripts, tuition bills) with application.
- 7. Letters of recommendation should be original and may arrive with the application or separately by mail or email. If separate, postmark/deadline applies, and emailed letters of recommendation will be accepted as attachments, on letterhead.

- 9. Scholarship applications must be emailed by November 24th to the scholarship committee contact.
- 10. For 2023 Winter Beef Classic Scholarships, the Michigan Jr. Livestock Society will be awarding a minimum of four \$500 scholarships.
- 11. The scholarship recipients will be announced at the Winter Beef Classic and on the Michigan Junior Livestock Facebook page.

- 12. At the presentation, the recipient's presence is expected but not required. Recipients must provide a copy of a tuition receipt (Fall 2023 to Spring 2024) to receive scholarship funds.
- 13. Scholarship recipients must refund any money not used for educational purposes or at an institution of higher education or trade school.
- 14. Previous MJLS scholarship recipients are not eligible. An individual may only win an MJLS Scholarship once, thereby recognizing more livestock youth that are working toward higher education.
